OVERVIEW

This qualification focuses on how to follow an individualised plan and provide person-centred support to carry out activities to maintain personal care and/or other activities of daily living for people in a home and community care setting in New South Wales.

This course can be delivered in a flexible program of classroom training and self-paced learning activities.

QUALIFICATION STRUCTURE

There are thirteen (13) units of competency to complete, comprising of seven (7) core units and six (6) elective units of competency. Please see the next page for our standard CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support (Home and Community) program.

Keep in mind, one of our ARC representatives will be happy to discuss unit selection, recognition of prior learning and credit transfer.

Entry Requirements:

There are no entry requirements for this qualification. Student will be required to provide their USI and complete a language, literacy and numeracy test.

As a requirement for work placement students will need to provide a National Police Check and Working with Children Check.

Where will the training take place?

Training and Assessment will take place:

Classroom: Training and assessment takes place in a classroom and involves discussions.

Self-directed learning: Further study and assessment activities are done by participants in their own time.

Assessment: The methods in which students are assessed may include written questions, case studies, projects and observations.

Work Placement: Students are required to complete a minimum of 120 hours of work at a care facility which can be organised by ARC Training.

What ARC Training provides?

We provide learning materials, assessment tools and a qualified trainer and assessor.

How long will the program run?

Students have up to 12 months to complete the course.
