OVERVIEW

This qualification provides the skills and knowledge for an individual to operate within the warehouse and logistics industry – multiskilling in receive, handle and dispatch goods coming into, or going out of stores or warehouses, stock replenishment and chain of responsibility in NSW.

This course can be delivered in a flexible program of classroom training and self-paced learning activities.

QUALIFICATION CONTENT

Participants will need to complete nineteen (19) units of competency, three (3) core units and sixteen (16) elective units for this qualification. Please see the next page for further information

Entry Requirements:

There are no entry requirements for this qualification. Student will be required to provide their USI and complete a language, literacy and numeracy test.

Where will the training take place?

Training and Assessment will take place:

Classroom – Training and assessment takes place in a classroom and involves discussions and activities.

Self-directed learning – read and study course material, research and review assessment in their own time.

Assessment – assessment may include written questions and observations.

How long will the program run?

The duration of the course is up to 12 months.

How much will it cost?
